OWN YOUR LIFE
EMPOWERMENT TRAINING
FOR WOMEN

The focus is on empowerment skills and exploring the areas of our lives that are in conflict with our empowerment. It provides a blend of didactic interactions, partnering exercises, journaling, and visualization. It is designed to promote discovery, awareness, insight, and a shift in perception. **This seminar is open to all women, not just women who have attended the Woman Within Training.**

This workshop includes:

- Victim within us: Language, perception, benefits, payoffs, and what's at risk to move beyond the victim within our self.
- Empowerment: Definitions, language, perception, benefits, and what's at risk.
- Feelings (the basic 5) & States of being - further exploration and insight
- Fear - How it shows up, what to do with it, and how to create safety solutions
- Core Needs and Wants: Identifying our core needs (both golden and shadow) and defining the wants that arise from them. How to ask for what we want in our life & the "victim" vs. "empowerment" ways in which we get them met.
- Walls vs. Boundaries - How to identify the defenses and set healthy boundaries
- Exploration of Shadow - identifying shadow & transforming it into healing and strength
- The mirrors of our life - How to use our world as a mirror for empowerment.
- Transformation of the past into empowerment for today and tomorrow.

Sherry is a crone for the Woman Within Training weekends. She has so much passion for this work that she staffed every weekend for several years to become a facilitator and then crone. Sherry is a personal growth trainer who does trainings all over the nation. She has great energy and is a very powerful woman and crone. BEING A BUDDHA BUSINESSPERSON

You're in the driver's seat. But you're not driving. You look straight down on the pavement as it rushes beneath you.

On the road, lounging dogs look up with trust as your driver maneuvers around them. Children play ball or chat in groups. On both sides of the road are three-wheelers, impossibly stuffed with four or five people. Your van maneuvers effortlessly around them.

As this game of chicken continues, you sense its graceful choreography. Your driver honks constantly; not to tell others to get out of his way, but to say, "I'm here. You're there."

Then you notice other cars doing the same. It's an unspoken language of give and take—mutual decisions about who backs off when. There's no swearing, no pounding the steering wheel. This driver is some kind of Buddha, you think.

Was this a dream? No. It's an experience from a recent journey I took to Sri Lanka. This road trip demonstrates a fundamental difference between our

Western culture and an Eastern one. Rather than competing for space on the Sri Lankan road, we collaborated as all of us made our way, together.

I know it's fashionable for go-get-'em business types to read "The Art of War" to plot turf game plans. But I've been reading the Dalai Lama's "The Art of Happiness" instead.

Buddhists believe most suffering comes from ego attachments. So how might we start on a more collaborative path to work happiness? Share your ideas with team members. Consider impermanent groupings that suit needs. Partner with the best of your competitors. Refer business to someone else if they're better equipped (it comes back in referrals just right for you). Release negative energy in non-destructive ways, like exercise. And most importantly, recognize the "Hey, that's mine!" mentality when it comes up.

I once spent 15 minutes with three competitors waiting to make a new business pitch. I proposed forming an alliance and getting the business that day—with each company doing what the client liked best about them. The money we'd have saved pitching could have been our first year's profit. The experience of forming a coalition could have created other opportunities. My company won the business, but I still wonder what might have been.

My favorite passage from "The Path To Tranquility" by the Dalai Lama reads: "A strong sense of separateness in the past has brought about competition and warring. But now. . .we need to communicate, hold dialogs and compromise. It would be good to have a bullet that searches for and hits the real troublemaker, which is within us." Sounds like Buddha Business to me.

These days, I'm conscious of the free flow of positive work relationships. And I concentrate on being happy—and recognizing when I *am* happy.

No, I'm not an Enlightened One yet. The minute I got behind the wheel back at home in the airport parking lot, I was swearing under my breath as we crawled along behind a too-slow driver. It was just like old times. But at least now, I understand why.
