FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE FUND

Here are some guidelines to consider when applying:

- ⊙ Applications are open to women in the Indianapolis and Louisville communities, no matter which training weekend the woman attends.
 - ⊙ The priority for Financial Assistance is for Woman Within Training Weekends.
 - ⊙ The Financial Assistance Committee will review the application and letter in the order in which they are received.
 - ⊙ In order for the Committee to process applications in a timely manner, all applications need to be submitted 6 weeks prior to the training or workshop.
 - ⊙ Discounts and loans are available for Trainings: Woman Within Training Weekend, Women Empowering Women, and Woman Within Level II.
 - ⊙ Loans are available for sanctioned workshops, including, but not limited to: Intellect and Accountability, Healing the Wounds of Shame, Your Sexual Self.
 - ⊙ Loans and discounts shall not exceed 1/2 the amount of the cost of the Training or Workshop.
 - ⊙ An agreement between the loan recipient and IN Our Circle must be in writing.
 - ⊙ The nonrefundable deposit must be submitted to the Registrar prior to Financial Assistance approval.

E-CIRCLE GUIDE TRAINING

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On Saturday, October 20, there will be an E-Circle guide training session. We will meet from 8AM to 5PM, with a short break for lunch. This session is facilitated by Michelle McCarty, at the request of women in the community of "IN Our Circle" and is not affiliated with any group or organization.

E-Circle guides will be needed, in pairs, to train newly formed E-Circles after the Woman Within Training Weekends.

PURPOSE AND GOAL:

To provide training techniques for the E-Circle guides, including:

1. Review the paperwork with the new women.
2. Explain and learn effective ways to teach the materials.

3. Create strategies to work with different types of personalities, i.e.: very needy, dominant, overpowering, and women who want to work at a deeper level.
4. Conflict resolution. (How to give the E-Circle a better understanding of how conflict resolution works to maintain connection. This will also help women to feel more comfortable leading the conflict resolution model.)
5. The language used in our community.
6. Exercises, to give the new E-Circle a foundation to start.
7. Provide a review of core exercises used in E-Circles.
8. Provide each woman an opportunity to step into her leadership role.

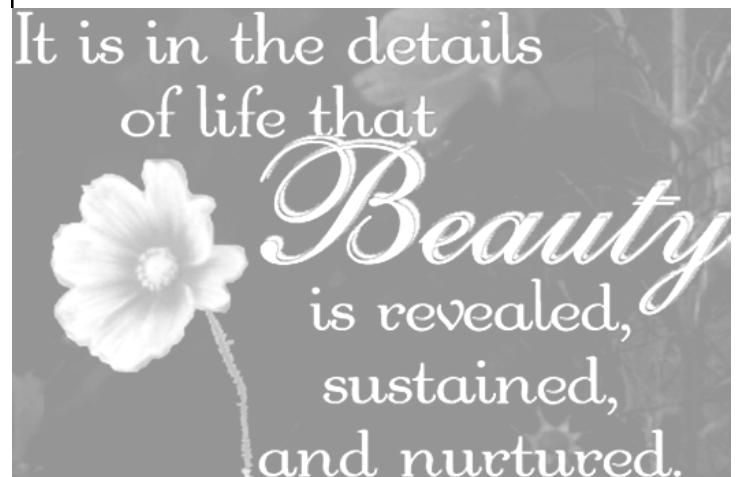

Participants of the Running With Iron John™ experience are men and women together in committed relationships, who are moved to take the next step in deepening their relationship and exploring their mission together as a couple. The experience has been designed to provide an opportunity for the couple to participate in a weekend that will bring them to a deeper level of understanding and commitment. This is an opportunity to connect at a deeper level, without any intense processing.

Men and women will come away having experienced a deeper and different connection with each other by exploring their relationship while relaxing in sacred space together.

- A weekend of uninterrupted time together away from the demands of the outside world.
- Meeting, connecting and sharing openly with other couples.
- Inclusion in a community of couples with similar hopes, fears, issues and joys.

UPCOMING WORKSHOP

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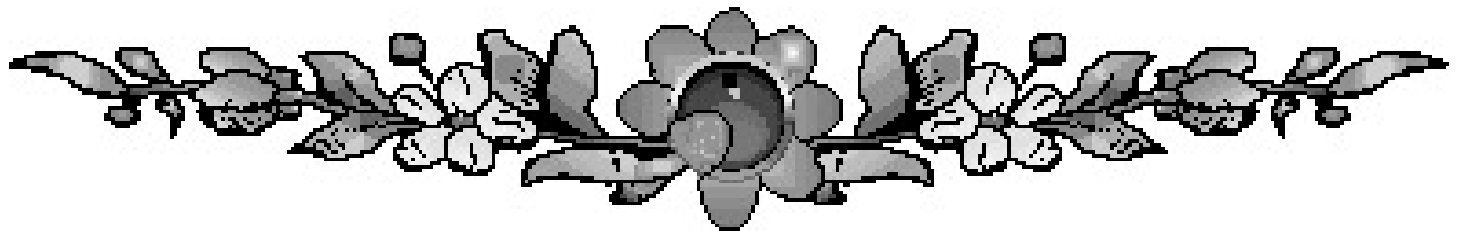

HOW CAN I GET MORE INVOLVED IN THE WWI COMMUNITY?

Another suggestion is to **ATTEND OPEN CIRCLE MEETINGS**, which are held the third Monday of every month. These meetings allow women to connect with the community as a whole. It's also a place to bring women who want to know more about the weekend. Oftentimes, Open Circles are the only way we can connect with women who are outside our own E-Group.

ATTENDING BOARD MEETINGS is always an option. Board Meetings are open to the

community and often involve great brainstorming sessions for new ideas. If you want to share your ideas of what the community could do together, or just want to know more about how the whole thing works, come to a Board Meeting. They're held the first Tuesday of every month at the Irvington United Methodist Church.

Another way to connect with the community and be involved would be to **JOIN A LISTSERV** on the internet. This gives you the chance to share your views and see what others have to say. It also lets you in on community announcements and keeps you updated on community events. It's easy to join:


